COURSE objective (course and seminar)

The course helps students prove their ability to comprehend and use the basic structures of the English language, with a direct focus on both written and oral communication at the intermediate and upper-intermediate level. Students will be encouraged to explore and analyse the complex phenomena of English grammar and morphology, in particular, guided as they are towards discovering new and special vocabularies, life-sciences oriented. The course builds upon the already existing skills, knowledge, and understanding related to all four language abilities (reading, writing, listening and speaking) as it focuses on turning students into proficient, autonomous speakers of English. One of this course's main objectives is that of organising and developing the necessary communication skills in English appropriate to the current multicultural, dynamic, thought-provoking international context.
